**Dr. Melissa Mueller**

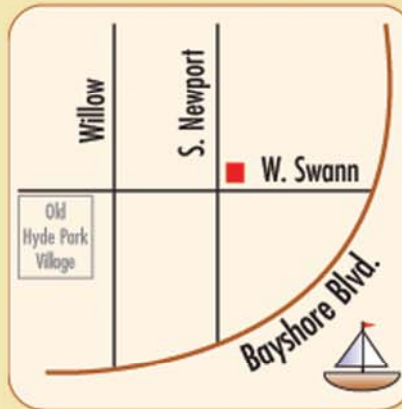
